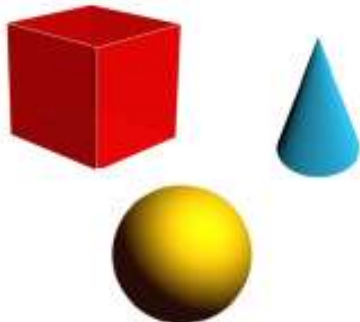

Emergency Drills and Preparations

We are continually updating our policies and procedures and we take particular care at this time of year in preparation for summer time and potential bushfire. Remember that school will be closed if the CFS declare the day *Catastrophic*. This is usually done about 4pm on the day before. In addition, all school transport services in the affected fire ban district(s) will be cancelled.

In the event of an emergency, please note the following:

- School is closed on Catastrophic Days. No-one will be on site.
- We will do our best to advise everyone via text message and other methods.
- If the day has not been declared *Catastrophic*, students are at school and there is a fire in the area, students will be kept safe on-site or off-site at the Kersbrook Solidier's Memorial Park (Football Oval) on Glover Street if necessary.
- The school phone: 0419 862 579 will be used to broadcast messages. You may text or call this phone but we do not continually monitor it. Call 8389 3068 for instant contact.
- If you remove your child in an emergency situation you must sign them out. Staff will have Red Slips to do this. It is imperative that the class teachers know where each and every student is during such an event.
- We will not send students with another parent or person unless we have the parent's permission. The school phone 0419862579 can be used to send a text from **your own mobile phone** if you want your child to be sent off site with another person. If we do not know that person, please ensure they have some identification such as a driver's licence.

Dear Parent,

Parents are welcome to watch their children at the Aquadome DECD swimming program. As an observer entry to watch is free, but you must enter via the main doors. Whilst at the pool please adhere to the Aquadome and DECD policies.

Students do not have access to the pool outside of their lesson time and we ask that you do not allow them in the pool except with their instructor and they must vacate the pool immediately after their lesson has finished.

Parents and siblings of students are not allowed to use the pool whilst the DECD program is operating, (unless as a paid patron of the pool and in the designated casual swimming areas).

Change rooms are provided and the changing of students on poolside is strictly prohibited.

As per Department of Education Swimming and Aquatics flyer re 'Role of Parents';
The DECD swimming and Aquatics program is a curriculum based program and as such the direct relationship is between the instructors and the school.

Where a parent attends in a private capacity they can assist the instructors by observing the following guidelines.

- Parents are asked not to communicate with the Instructor or any child during the lesson. Direct communication in this way does distract and can impact on the safety of the class.
- Parents to contact the school, or school representative on site, if they require any further information about the program or their child's involvement in the program.

Any parent wishing to use a camera in the facility needs to;

1. Get approval from the School / Teachers.
2. Read and adhere to the YMCA policy, sign at reception and wear the sticker prior to taking photos. **Please do not take photos of the instructors unless you have their permission.**
3. Only take photos of your own child.
4. The Aquadome has a strict '**NO VIDEO CAMERA Policy**'.

TIME FOR A SPRING CLEAN!

Is there anything better than being in the garden on a beautiful Spring day? Why not use the opportunity to improve your home security!

- Ensure appropriate keyed locks are fitted to all doors and windows.
- Even when you are outside, be sure to lock all doors and windows.
- Install a quality security screen door to the front and rear doors.
- Keep trees and bushes in front of doors and windows trimmed to avoid being used as hiding places.
- Break down packaging of expensive items and place it in your bin. Don't leave it next to your bin on the street.
- Store keys out of sight and in a safe place.
- Lock your meter box to prevent thieves interfering with your power supply (contact your local electricity provider for more information).
- Consider installing external sensor lighting.

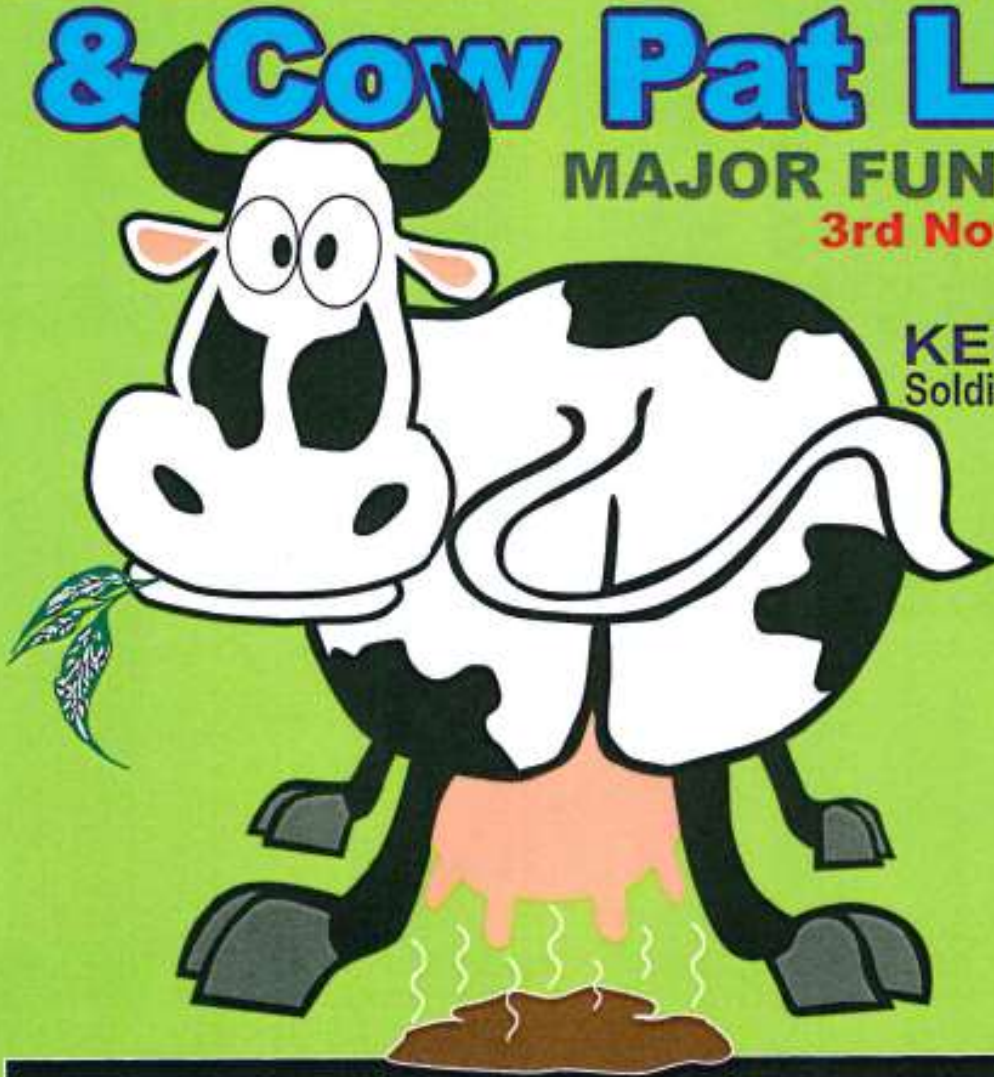
