## School Garden



This year as part of the Health Education program, classes will be participating in the school garden.

Being places where children spend a large portion of their time, schools have a critical role to play in educating students about nutrition and the benefits of a healthy diet and lifestyle.

School gardens are a wonderful way to use the schoolyard as a classroom, connect students with the natural world and the source of their food. Gardens teach students valuable gardening, agriculture concepts and skills that integrate across the curriculum in subjects, such as math, science, art, health and physical education.

Miss Fechner (Miss S) will be working with Room 3 this term to prepare the garden beds. Miss S has already sourced some supplies from Ashton Co-op and Julie and Peter at Kersbrook Hardware who have generously donated items for our gardens. Miss S and students hope to be producing food, cooking and displaying their produce soon.
