We learnt a lot about native Australian animals at Warrawong. Many species have become extinct due to changes to the landscape, their food and habitat requirements and predation by introduced species such as cats and foxes.


In this photo, Kat is holding a baby Bettong. Bettongs used to live all over Australia but died out after colonisation. People are trying to reintroduce Bettongs in some places but they have to be inside special fences which exclude cats and foxes. Bettongs are like little rabbits but hop like kangaroos. Bettongs used to live in Kersbrook too.



How good are Barn Owls? This little fellow was rescued from the wild as he has a bung wing. Barn Owls need hollows and it can take a tree 100 years to have good hollows for owls and other creatures.

We can help by saving older trees - not cutting them down. Dead trees are important to keep for tree hollows. People can put up nesting boxes which helps. Everyone can make a difference to help the animals have places to live.

Adelaide Zoo Excursion



We enjoyed our day at the Adelaide Zoo learning about habitats and life cycles. The pandas, lions and orang-utan were favourites.

The bilby pictured below in the nocturnal area is so cute. Bilbies were ubiquitous throughout Australia and it is easy to see how they were displaced by the rabbit who would have used the same habitat and food sources.

Our magnificent Sumatran Orang-Utan means **Man of the Forest** in Bahasa Indonesian. You can see why when he makes a tool of the frond to poke through the bars to access his food. All the animals pictured are critically endangered.




